Professor Ian Whyte awarded fellowships

Professor Ian Whyte has just been awarded Fellowships in both the American Academy of Clinical Toxicology (FAACT) and American College of Medical Toxicology (FACMT) in recognition of his work in Clinical Toxicology practice, research and education.

He is the first Australian to be awarded a Fellowship in the AACT and will be travelling to the annual North American Congress of Clinical Toxicology in October to be inducted into his Fellowships.

Ian said, "It is very pleasing to be recognised internationally for your day to day work.

"It is not the reason you do your job, but it is nice to receive the accolade."

Professor Whyte was nominated by the President-Elect of the AACT and the President of the ACMT, which is a ringing endorsement of his work in Clinical Toxicology over the last 25 years.

Since he first started in the field in 1987 at the Royal Newcastle Hospital, and then at the Mater from 1991, Professor Whyte and the Clinical Toxicology team have seen over 18,000 admissions.
